Goaltender - Kevin Hoy - Bay State Breakers - 1991 (Ft. Lauderdale, FL)

Kevin made 50 saves on Wednesday night against the Jr. Bruins and 56 saves against the Springfield Jr. Pics on Sunday for the Breakers. Kevin now has a .922 save percentage for the season.



Defenseman - Robert Stone - Potomac Patriots - 1995

Robert recorded his first goal of his junior hockey career this past weekend. Robert is a smart, physical defense man, who makes a great first pass out of the zone. He is an anchor on the blue line for the Patriots. Robert is a 95 birth year, and in his first year of juniors.



Forward - Ryan Fehnel - Mass Maple Leafs - 1993 (Phoenix, AZ)

Fehnel led the Leafs to a semifinal finish as the Leafs went 2-2-1 in the Merychurst College Showcase having 7 goals 5 assists for 12 pts. He also received the player of the game with a 2 goal performance in a Leafs 6-3 win over AJAX



The **Bay State Breakers** (ESHL) team (3-1-0-0) hosted the undefeated and un-scored upon Jr. Bruins (2-0-0-0) at the Rockland Ice Arena on Wednesday evening. The Bruins would open up the scoring at the midway point of the period but the Breakers would come right back to tie the game on a Derek Murphy (Quincy, MA) goal with assists going to Shayne McGowan (Scottsville, NY) and Tyler Robison (Omaha, NE). The 1-1 score would stand into the second when the Bruins would add two more goals taking a 3-1 lead into the third period. In the third the Bruins would add two more insurance goals to cap off the 5-1 win. Kevin Hoy (Ft. Lauderdale, FL) made 50 saves for the Breakers in the loss.

The Breakers (3-2-0-0) again hosted the Jr. Bruins a little more than 48 hours later on Friday evening and the Breakers came out flying and took a 2-0 lead on a pair of Mitchell Boothman (Rockland, MA) goals, the second a power play goal assisted by Cam Miglietta (Pembroke, MA). The Jr. Bruins would get one back before the end of the first cutting the Breaker lead in half a 2-

1. In the second period the Jr. Bruins would score 3 unanswered goals before Vinnie Cameron (Quincy, MA) scored a power play goal from Mason Sloan (Abington, MA) with 3:28 to play in the period. In the 3rd the Bruins would add 3 more unanswered goals before Mason Sloan (Abington, MA) would score to cut the Jr. Bruins lead to 7-4. Brian Brady (Weymouth, MA) made 41 saves in goal for the Breakers.

On Sunday the Breakers (3-3-0-0) travelled to Holyoke to take on the Springfield Jr. Pics (3-4-0-0). Mason Sloan scored a pair of 1st period goals the first one on a power play from Jake Pendrak (Hanson, MA) and Matt Guillemette (Brockton, MA) and the second and even strength goal from Andrew Contillo (Crofton, MD). The Jr. Pics would cut the lead in half and the period would finish with a Breaker 2-1 lead. In the 2nd the score remained 2-1 Breakers until the final second of the period when Springfield scored on an offensive zone faceoff with the goaltender pulled for the extra attacker to even the score at two apiece. In the third the 2-2 score held until 9:31 to play when the Jr. Pics would take their first lead of the game and then add to their lead with 5:48 to play. Parker Shaw (Silver Lake, OH) would score on the power play from Vinnie Cameron to cut the Jr. Pics lead to 4-3. With the goalie pulled for the extra skater the Jr. Pics sealed the win with an empty net goal and then would add one more before the end of the game to take the 6-3 win. Kevin Hoy (Ft. Lauderdale, FL) made 56 saves in goal for the Breakers who fell to (3-4-0-0) and next take on Suffolk in Hookset New Hampshire on Sunday October 9th at 11:40am when they'll try to even their league record.



The **Brewster Bulldogs** ESHL split two games on the weekend. Winning 5-2 Saturday against the Philadelphia Revolution down in Warwick and losing 5-1 to New York Apple Core on Sunday.

On Saturday the Bulldogs travelled to Warwick, PA to play the Philadelphia Revolution for the third time in this short season. The first period saw the Revolution scoring the first goal 3:25 into the period. The Bulldogs came back a short time later to tie the game at 1. The rest of the period went back and forth as Brewster came out on top 3-2 after one period of play. In the second period Brewster played a stingy defense outshooting Philadelphia 15-7. Brewster scored the lone goal in the period taking a 4-2 lead into the 2nd intermission. The Revolution came out hard in the third outshooting Brewster 10-5 but was denied by fine goaltending by Matt Rubenstein. Again, Brewster scored the only goal of the period on an empty netter by Eric Staropoli and escaped with a 5-2 victory. Michael Benincasa led Brewster with 2 goals and an assist while Bradley Alexander added a goal and 2 assists. Joe LeVeille

also scored a goal and had an assist. Matt Rubenstein earned the win between the pipes with 29 saves.

On Sunday the Bulldogs played host to New York Apple Core in ESHL action. Brewster came out strong in the opening period and scored a late goal by Joe Leveille to take a 1-0 lead into the first intermission. Brewster came out hungry again in the second period as they controlled the first few minutes of the period drawing several penalties including having a 5 on 3 power play for almost 4 minutes. Through some exceptional goaltending from Apple Core's Matthew Almengor, the momentum began to switch to Apple Core's favor. Apple Core's Mark DeVaughn scored a shorthanded goal late in the 5 minute major and it was all Apple Core from there. Apple Core added a goal less than 3 minutes later to take a 2-1 lead into the 2nd intermission. Apple Core took the momentum into the third period and scored 2 quick goals in the first 5:30 of the third to take a commanding 4-1 lead. Brewster came on with a late surge of shots but all were turned away by Almengor who earned the victory with 33 saves.

This upcoming weekend the Bulldogs will travel to the New Hampshire Jr. Monarchs Showcase for three league games. They start the weekend with the always daunting task of playing the undefeated Boston Jr. Bruins on Saturday morning. On Saturday afternoon they will take on the Potomac Patriots for the second time this season in Western Conference action. In their previous showdown the Bulldogs had a hard fought 3-1 victory. Their weekend finishes up with a very strong New England Huskies on Sunday.

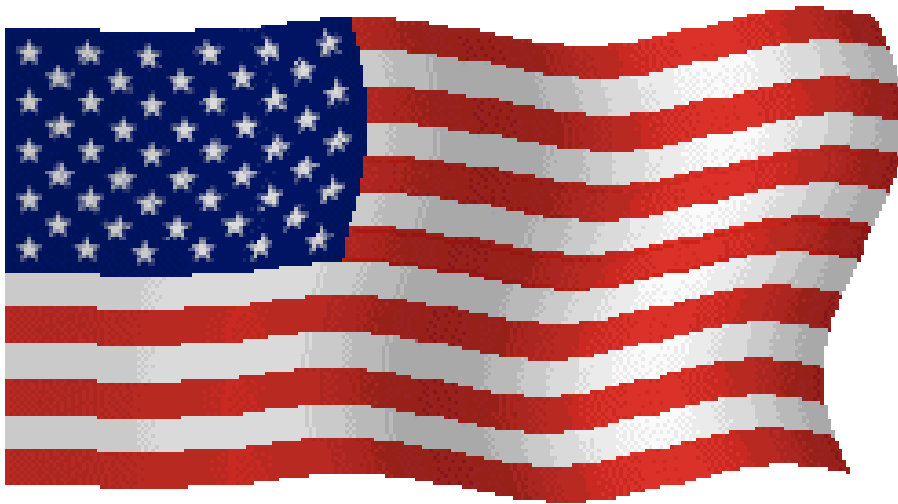
