**Forward: Hagen Nemzek - Mass Maple Leafs - 1991**

**(Williamsburg, VA)**

In 3 games this weekend, Leafs veteran forward Hagen Nemzek tallied 16 points in wins over Springfield and Bay State. Nine of those points came in the Bay State game.



**Defense: Sam Jenkins - Mass Maple Leafs - 1993 (Dartmouth, MA)**

Sam Jenkins, in 3 games this weekend tallied 2 goals and 4 assists and was solid on the Leafs blueline with a plus 10.



**Goaltender: TJ Hollen - Potomac Patriots - 1996**

## Huskies Drop 3<sup>rd</sup> Straight Heartbreaker to Monarchs.



The **New England Huskies** came into the game desperate for a win, after dropping the previous two games with late empty net goals. Both teams came ready to play, as the physical play was evident right from the drop of the puck.

The **New Hampshire Monarchs** got on the board first with a power play goal by **Connor Merrick**, assisted by **Kyle Broussard**. The Huskies answered late in the period on a power play, when **Mark Ferullo's** shot from the point was tipped in the high slot by **Eddie Barrasso** and found its way into the back of the net. The Huskies took the lead in the 2<sup>nd</sup> when **Tomas Parizek** found some open ice on the power play and skated down the wing and fired a slap shot that beat the Monarchs goalie far side.

The Monarchs answered late in the 2<sup>nd</sup> period with a power play goal by **Derek Clark**, with the assist going to **Joe Libby**. Five minutes into the 3<sup>rd</sup> the Monarchs, again on the power play, took the lead when **Austin Sprague** netted a goal, assisted by Derek Clark and Joe Libby. Just over a minute later the Monarchs took command of the game when **Colin Morrissey** scored with the assist going to **Calvin Edson**.

The Huskies fought back when **Dustin Paquette** broke through the defense, after a nice pass from **Alec Hazelwood**, and found a hole in the Monarchs goalie, making it 4-3 with 10:58 left in the 3<sup>rd</sup>. The Huskies had their chances to tie, but just could not find the back of the net.

The monarchs put the game out of reach with an empty net goal scored by **Brendan Tazumi**, assisted by Connor Merrick. The Monarchs improved to 5-2-0 and the Huskies fall to 2-4-0 on the season.



The **Brewster Bulldogs** ESHL team's off weekend couldn't have come at a better time. Playing three games in two days at the New Hampshire Monarchs Showcase with the Jr. Bruins, Potomac Patriots and NE Huskies, the team was a little banged up. While the team had some very good practices, a weekend away from the rink provided some much needed rest for the team. The Bulldogs look forward to getting back to game action when they play host to the Potomac Patriots this weekend in Brewster. Game times are 4:20 pm Saturday and 9:00 am on Sunday. Brewster looks to exact revenge after they dropped a 3-2 decision to the Patriots at the Huskies Showcase. A hard fought game in which Brewster led 2-1 in the second half. The Bulldogs and Potomac have split the season series so far at 1 game apiece. Brewster beat Potomac 3-1 at the Jr. Bruins Shootout in their first game.

The **Mass Maple Leafs** remain the only undefeated team with their 4 wins this past week. They defeated the Springfield Pics twice 8-2 and 6-2. They defeated Bay State Breakers 16-0 and in the battles of the unbeaten Boston Junior Bruins 3-2 in overtime fashion.

The Leafs are being led offensively by Joey Fernandes with 35 goals 18 assists for 53 points followed by CJ Cordeiro 16 goals and 31 assists for 47 points, Ryan Fehnel with 15 goals 27 assists for 42 points and Adam McGrath with 19 goals and 19 assists for 38 points.

The Leafs defense is being led by Kyle Gasior with 17 points followed by Sam Jenkins with 14 points. Goalie Tommy Futch posted the 25 save shutout versus the Breakers for his first ESHL win and Donald Hesse picked up a pair of wins versus the Pics and the Bruins to extend his league record to 4-0. The Leafs are currently 7-0 with the NH Monarchs to play at home this weekend.



The **Bay State Breakers** (ESHL) team (3-5-0-0) took on the New Hampshire Monarchs on Saturday night at the Rockland Ice Rink. After the two teams played to a scoreless first period Derek Murphy (Quincy, MA) scored on a power play with the assist going to goaltender Kevin Hoy (Ft. Lauderdale, FL) to give the Breakers a 1-0 lead 4:45 into the second. Vinnie Cameron (Quincy, MA) would score on a breakaway with 10:01 to play on the power play to give the Breakers a 2-0 lead.

The Monarchs would comeback scoring two goals in the final 4:27 of the second to even the game at two apiece heading into the third. In the third the Monarchs would take the lead on a power play goal with 14:36 to play in the game and that goal would stand up to be the game winner. Kevin Hoy (Ft. Lauderdale, FL) made 44 saves in the loss for the Breakers. On Sunday the Breakers (3-6-0-0) played host to the unbeaten Mass Maple Leafs and fell 16-0.

The Breakers next take on the Monarchs on Saturday October 22<sup>nd</sup> at the Rockland Ice Rink at 6:10pm.

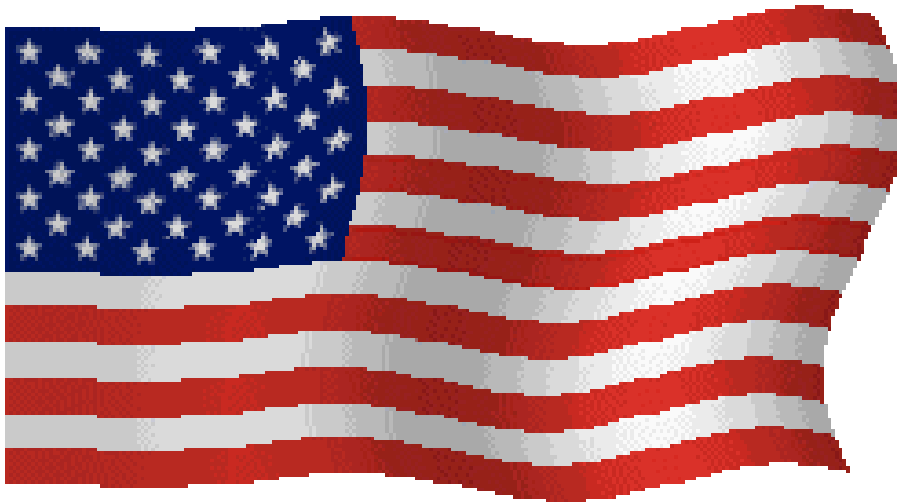
