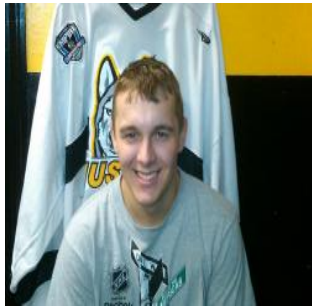

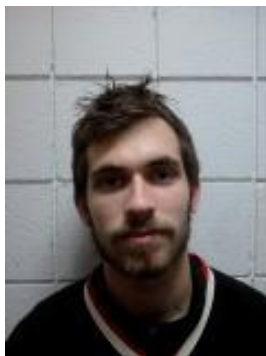
ESHL PLAYERS OF THE WEEK: Week ending 11/06/11

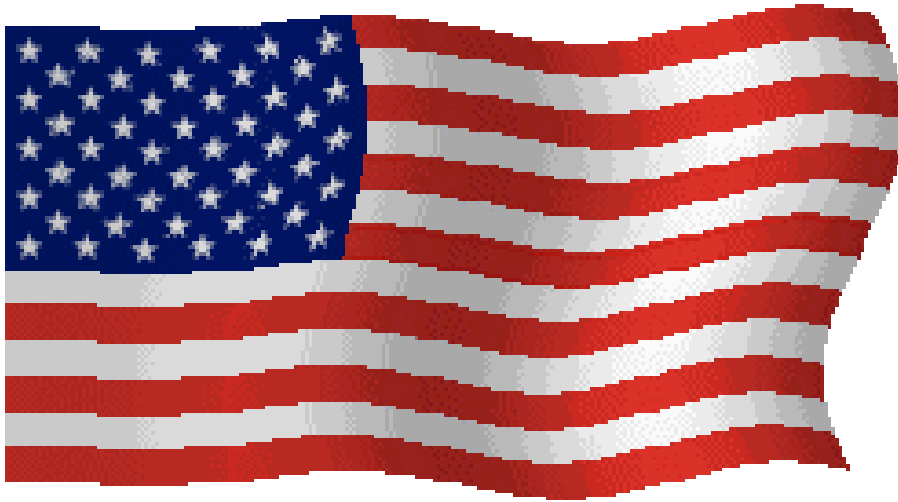
